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Club 321 rocks downtown Worcester's contemporary music scene

Fall series at Mechanics Hall opens on Thursday, September 26, with Harshitha Krishnan Trio

September 5, 2023 (Worcester, MA)—Grammy-nominated performing and recording artist <u>Harshitha Krishnan</u> opens Mechanics Hall's fall Club 321 series on **Thursday, September 26**. Known for her distinctive fusion of Indian and contemporary western music, Krishnan will perform her original arrangements, creating a singular musical experience that takes listeners on a journey of unfiltered emotions, sounds, and textures from around the world.

Club 321 is a live music series featuring an eclectic blend of musicians performing Americana, jazz, world music, blues, and more. The performances take place in Washburn Hall on the second level of Mechanics Hall, 321 Main Street, Worcester. Performances begin at 7:00 p.m., with doors opening at 6:15 p.m. Tickets are \$20 purchased in advance; \$25 at the door. Mechanics Hall members receive 15% off a single ticket. Ticket holders must be at least 18 years old. Seating includes cabaret-style tables and some theater-style with a cash bar and light refreshments for sale. About Harshitha Krishnan

Harshitha Krishnan is a Grammy nominated performing and recording artist, music educator, and social justice advocate of Indian origin from Lagos, Nigeria. With a strong background in western classical music, she embraced soul, R&B, alternative, jazz, Indian folk and other world music styles, creating her own distinctive and eclectic sound: a fusion of Indian and contemporary western elements. Through performing her original music, arrangements of Indian and Pop tunes, jazz fusion pieces and more, Krishnan creates a singular musical experience that takes listeners on a journey of unfiltered emotions, exploring sounds and textures from around the world.

A graduate of Berklee College of Music, Krishnan has worked with an impressive roster of renowned musicians, including A.R.Rahman, Ilayaraaja, Gary Burton, Vijay Prakash, Michael McDonald, Shankar Mahadevan, Shreya Ghoshal, Pablo Ziegler, Bill Whelan, Alejandro Sanz, Clinton Cerejo, Javed Ali, Sivamani, and Javier Limone. She was a leading member of the Berklee Indian Ensemble whose debut album was nominated for 'Best Global Music Album' at the 65th Grammy® Awards, and performs with her vocal group 'MuZù', the Yotam Ishay Chamber Group and Utako Toyama's 'SkyBridge'. Since 2021, she has served on the Voice, Ensemble, Harmony and Professional Music Faculty at Berklee College of Music.

Built in 1857, Mechanics Hall is internationally regarded as one of the world's great concert halls for its superb acoustics and 19th-century elegance. Regionally, it is widely considered to be Worcester's finest meeting place. The world's most renowned orchestras and performers—from the London Philharmonic to Yo-Yo Ma and Ella Fitzgerald to Linda Ronstadt—have taken the Hall's stage. Among the many luminaries who have spoken at





Mechanics Hall are Charles Dickens, Susan B. Anthony, Frederick Douglass, and Mark Twain. In addition to serving as a premiere venue and recording site, Mechanics Hall offers inspiring cultural experiences for diverse audiences through a variety of creative initiatives—including free concerts, community events, a youth chorus, and collaborative programs with local colleges and non-profit organizations. A non-profit organization, Mechanics Hall is owned and operated by the Worcester County Mechanics Association (est. 1842). It is listed in the National Register of Historic Places. The accessible entrance to Mechanics Hall is located on Waldo Street. Elevators are available in the ground-floor Waldo lobby and provide access to the second and third floors. There is no elevator access to the balcony. The concert will take place in the Great Hall on the third level.
